Registration & Payment

Online registration only. There are waiting lists on full sessions. Proof of age may be required. Registration cannot be confirmed unless submitted with full payment.

- FULL PAYMENT. Payment by **E-transfer ONLY**. We will not be accepting any other form of payment at the office. For E-Transfer, send payment to uppercanadaskating@bellnet.ca. We have set up for autodeposit. We DO NOT accept credit card payment.

- Full payment includes the yearly \$44 Skate Canada fee per skater and the Upper Canada Club Fee of \$50 per family.

Terms and Conditions

- Registration cannot be accepted from any skater with an outstanding balance.
- A \$45 fee is charged for NSF cheques.
- A \$50 processing fee is charged to all refunds.
- Application may be cancelled if full payment is not received by the due date.
- Application may also be cancelled if the skater does not show up for the first 2 weeks and has not notified us by email.

- All private coaching fees are payable directly to the skater's coach. Upper Canada is not responsible for the collection of individual coaching fees and is not involved in any disputes between the skater/parent and the private coach.

- There are no substitutions of days or make up classes.

Schedules and prices are subject to change at the discretion of the club. Check our website for all changes.

Refund Policy

- **Skate Canada Fee and Upper Canada Club Fee are non-refundable.**
- **Program cancellation due to Government order** - Partial or full refund (by cheque or credit) depending on the percentage of refund the club receive from the City of Toronto for ice rental.
- Refund request due to medical situation must be in writing, addressed to the Board of Directors and accompany with a doctor's note.
- A \$50 processing fee is charged for all refunds except for program cancellation due to Government order.
- No make ups or refunds for sessions missed due to illness, vacations, holidays, competitions, tests, bad weather, maintenance, equipment failure, breakdowns, repairs or management disputes.
- No refunds for club events once the fee is submitted.

CanSkate Programs

Please Note: Coaches must maintain a distance of 2m from skaters at all times. Hands-on coaching is prohibited. Hence Pre-School and Pre-CanSkate programs will NOT be offered at this stage.

CANSKATE 1-6 (Ages 5+)

CanSkate is Skate Canada's learn-to-skate program that teaches fundamental movement and basic skills. There are 6 stages to this program. Each class includes a 15 min. warm up, a 30 min. group lesson with a professional coach (1:10), and a 15 min cool down. CSA approved hockey helmets with chip straps are mandatory and face-masks for younger skaters are highly recommended.

Eligibility: Ages 5+ old as of October 15, 2020. Skaters must have passed Pre-CanSkate or be able to skate the entire perimeter of the ice with speed, skate forward and backwards and stop. Skaters who do not meet the criteria will be asked to withdraw from the program. No exception.

TEEN/ADULT LEARN TO SKATE (Ages 13+)

The Teen/Adult Learn to Skate program teaches the fundamentals of skating required for recreational skating, hockey, ringette and figure skating. Lessons are given in group format and skaters progress at their own pace. Session includes a 15 min warm up and a 30 min group lesson. This session is open to skaters age 13+ and older who are in the "learn to skate" stage. Skaters will be grouped according to age and ability. CSA approved hockey helmets with chip straps are mandatory. Private lessons are available.

Eligibility: Ages 13-17 as of Dec. 31, 2020 for the Teen session; ages 18+ as of Oct.15, 2020 for the Adult session. Skater must be able to move/skate forward without assistance. Skaters who do not meet the criteria will be asked to withdraw from the program.

Private Lessons

Private lessons are available only during the warm-up and cool down on the CanSkate 1-6 session. **COVID Consideration: Private lessons are not available from October to December 2020 and may resume in January 2021 depending on the situation.**

Safety

• Rowan's Law - Concussion Awareness
Under this law, signed acknowledgement form is not required for skaters in the CanSkate program. However, it is important to understand the seriousness of concussion. Concussion Awareness information is available on our website.

COVID Consideration:

- Parents/Guardians must leave the arena after the skater has checked in. It is recommended that parents/guardians (especially those of young children) to remain close by and can come to the arena quickly.
- Parents of skaters 10 years and under must be able to reach the arena within 15 minutes.
- CSA approved hockey helmets with chip straps are mandatory for all skaters on CanSkate 1-6 and

Teen/Adult Learn to Skate sessions. Optional for skaters who are on Stage 6.

- Helmets with face shield are recommended for young skaters.

- **COVID Consideration:** CanSkaters are recommended to have a face shield on their helmets. You can make your own with medium plastic and velcro or tape.
- Skaters must not go on the ice until their session begins and a coach is on the ice.
- Skaters may remove their mask to skate, but as soon as skaters leave the ice surface, they must put the mask back on. This includes stepping off the ice to tie skates, rest or going to the bathroom.

COVID-19 Considerations (refer to our website for details)

- COVID waiver must be signed before the skater is allowed to skate.
- Must self-screen in accordance with current public health guidelines before heading to the club.
- Parents/guardians are not permitted beyond the check in area. Up to one accompanying parent, guardian or other adult for each skater under the age of 18 is allowed to accompany the skater to the check in area. No siblings are allowed to accompany skater and parent.
- Verbal screening will be conducted at the designated entrance.
- Must arrive not earlier than 15 minutes before start of session. Skaters must arrive in the skating clothes, skates (with hard skate guards on) and helmet (if required).
- Leave the arena immediately after your session.
