

Club Rules and Regulations

The following Club Rules & Regulations apply to all **UCSC skaters, board members, coaches, staff, parents/guardians** and **guests** while on the premises of the **Mitchell Field Arena & Community Centre**. Where applicable, these rules also apply at any **other location** where club programs are held.

These rules are in place for the **safety** and **well-being** of everyone involved.

Gear and Attire

- **1.** Everyone on the **ice** must wear **skates**. No other footwear is permitted on the ice surface.
- 2. CSA-approved helmets are mandatory for skaters in the Pre-CanSkate and CanSkate (Stages 1-5), and Teen/Adult Learn to Skate session. Helmets are optional for skaters in Stage 6. Hockey helmets with a cage and chinstrap are mandatory for skaters ages 3 to 5 and recommended for young skaters and those who wear glasses.
- 3. Corrective eyewear must be worn on the ice whenever applicable.
- **4.** Scarves and loose-fitting hats are not permitted on the ice. Snug-fitting hats are allowed for skaters who feel cold.
- 5. Skaters with hair longer than chin length must tie it back.
- 6. Practice wear should be comfortable and form-fitting to allow free movement and ensure coaches can observe proper technique. Skating dresses, skirts, and yoga pants are acceptable. Dresses must be worn with appropriate skating tights or bottoms.
- 7. The following attire is not permitted on the ice unless part of an ice show costume:
 - a) Jeans, shorts, or denim-style pants
 - b) Sleeveless tops, tank tops, tube tops, low necklines, or bare midriffs
 - c) Clothing with offensive language or imagery
 - d) Props or accessories

Coaching

- 1. Skaters participating in STAR 3+ and Adult STARSkate sessions must hire a coach for a minimum of 15 minutes per skating day.
- 2. Parents are not permitted to coach or instruct from the boards.



On-Ice Conduct

- 1. All skaters and guests must be **registered** and have **paid in full** before entering the ice. Failure to do so will result in immediate removal.
- 2. Skaters must remain aware of their surroundings and yield appropriately to others with the right of way.
- **3. Eating, drinking** (other than bottled water), and **chewing gum** are **not allowed** on the ice.
- **4.** Foul language or inappropriate behaviour from skaters, parents, or coaches will not be tolerated on or off the ice. (Please refer to the Skate Canada Code of Ethics for more information.)
- 5. No skater may enter the ice without a Skate Canada-certified coach present.
- 6. All doors to the ice surface must remain closed and latched.
- 7. Skaters and coaches must **exit the ice** as soon as the **Zamboni** reaches the arena doors. Please be **mindful** of your **session end time** and **leave the ice promptly** to keep all sessions on schedule.

Music

- **1. Coaches have priority** when requesting music. Please use this privilege **responsibly**.
- 2. The skater whose music is playing has the right of way. All skaters must stay aware of their surroundings regardless of whose music is on.
- **3.** Choreography should be practiced using a personal device, not the general sound system.
- **4. Headphones, earbuds**, or any type of personal listening device are **not allowed** on the ice.
- **5.** Only **designated music operators, board members** and **professional coaches** may operate the **sound equipment**.

Off-Ice Conduct

- 1. Skate guards must always be worn when off the ice.
- 2. Skaters and parents must use **designated change rooms** to **put on or remove skates**. Changing skates in the **viewing area** or elsewhere in the community centre is **strictly prohibited**.
- **3.** Parents of skaters aged 10 years and under (CanSkate or STARSkate) must remain on the premises for the duration of their child's session.
- 4. Please help keep the viewing area, change rooms, and washrooms clean.
- 5. Defacing club or arena property is strictly prohibited and may result in the loss of skating privileges.
